

THE VIKSIT BHARAT 2047 VISION: A PARADIGM FOR HOLISTIC NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

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The vision of Viksit Bharat @2047, which represents India's ambitious trajectory toward becoming a fully developed nation by the centenary of its independence, is fundamentally rooted in a multi-dimensional transformation that integrates economic prosperity with cultural self-assurance and social cohesion¹. While traditional development metrics often focus on Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth and infrastructure, the Indian model for 2047 posits that true development must be holistic, reaching every citizen and fostering a sense of national pride and unity³. This report examines the critical role of cultural integration in this vision, analysing how institutional frameworks, traditional knowledge systems, and the creative economy serve as essential drivers for building a resilient, inclusive, and globally influential Bharat.

The Strategic Framework of Viksit Bharat 2047

The government's mission statement for Viksit Bharat 2047 defines a developed nation not merely through high per capita income but through universal access to quality education, healthcare, and housing, alongside leadership in global innovation and social justice². The blueprint for this transformation is supported by four pivotal pillars: the youth (*Yuva*), the underprivileged (*Garib*), women (*Mahilayen*), and farmers (*Annadata*)¹. These pillars represent the focus of social empowerment and resource allocation intended to drive progress toward a \$30 trillion to \$40 trillion economy within the next two decades¹.

Macro-Economic and Social Targets for 2047

The socio-cultural goals of the vision are inextricably linked to specific economic milestones outlined in the Union Budget 2025-26 and subsequent policy roadmaps. These targets aim to create a self-reliant economy where the benefits of growth are equitably distributed across all sections of society¹.

The shift from fragmented development to holistic transformation requires a "developed" mindset, which the government seeks to cultivate through *Jan Bhagidari* (people's participation)³. In this context, cultural integration becomes the social adhesive that ensures economic progress does not lead to cultural erosion but instead reinforces India's unique civilisational identity.

Institutional Engines of National Integration: Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat

Launched on 31st October 2015 to commemorate the 140th birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat' (EBSB) initiative is the most significant institutional effort to promote national integration through cultural diversity⁶. The program operates on the principle that India's strength lies in the harmonious coexistence of its diverse identities, moving beyond homogeneity to prosper on mutual knowledge and admiration⁸.

The State-Pairing Mechanism and Its Social Impact

The primary mechanism of EBSB is the rotational pairing of states and Union Territories (UTs). This structured engagement model connects disparate regions—such as pairing Maharashtra with Odisha or Punjab with Andhra Pradesh—to facilitate year-long interactions in language, trade, culture, and tourism⁷. By fostering "internal cultural diplomacy," the initiative encourages states to act as cultural ambassadors to one another, reducing regional stereotypes and the sense of being a "stranger" in one's own country⁷.

The sociological impact of these exchanges is significant; research indicates that interpersonal cultural exposure is more effective at reducing regional prejudice than top-down political integration¹². By 2025, the Yuva Sangam phase had facilitated exposure tours for over 5,200 youth, providing them with a "practically lived experience" of India's unity in diversity⁷.

Economic Multipliers of Cultural Exchange

Cultural integration under EBSB is not limited to performance; it has tangible economic spill-overs. By highlighting lesser-known destinations in partner states, the initiative boosts inter-state tourism and related service industries⁶. Furthermore, craft *melas* and culinary festivals integrated into the program provide artisans and local entrepreneurs from remote areas with platforms to showcase their products, contributing to the "Vocal for Local" mission and protecting marginalised traditional crafts¹⁰.

Case Study: Kashi Tamil Sangamam as a Civilisational Catalyst

The Kashi Tamil Sangamam (KTS) represents a paradigm shift in how India reimagines its civilisational continuum¹². This initiative seeks to rediscover and strengthen the ancient bonds between Tamil Nadu and Kashi (Varanasi), two of India's oldest and most significant cultural and intellectual centres⁸. It transcends the boundaries of a cultural festival, serving as a platform to integrate heritage with modern academic and technological frameworks¹².

Historical and Spiritual Foundations

The link between Kashi and Tamil Nadu is rooted in centuries of spiritual and scholarly exchange. Historical records indicate that Pandiyan rulers, such as Adi Veera Parakrama Pandiyan in the 14th-15th century, travelled to Kashi to bring a Shiva *lingam* to the South, leading to the establishment of Tenkasi ("Dakshin Kashi")¹³. The KTS revives this tradition, highlighting how pilgrimage historically functioned as a mechanism for national integration¹².

Academic and Economic Synergies

A critical outcome of the KTS is the institutionalisation of inter-civilisational scholarship. This includes the establishment of a Tamil Chair at Banaras Hindu University (BHU) and the introduction of Tamil language instruction in Kashi schools, ensuring that cultural exchange moves from the performative to the academic¹². Economically, the initiative has facilitated "GI Synergies" between the handloom clusters of Kanjeevaram and Banarasi silk weavers¹². By collaborating on design and marketing, these artisans leverage their respective Geographical Indication statuses to create high-value products, aligning with UNESCO's Creative Economy framework¹².

The Orange Economy: Culture and Creativity as Economic Drivers

The 'Orange Economy,' or the Creative Economy, encompasses knowledge-based activities that integrate culture, creativity, technology, and intellectual property (IP)¹⁷. As India transitions toward a service-led growth model, this sector is identified as a primary engine for innovation and employment, particularly for the digital-native youth population¹⁹.

Economic Projections and Growth Trajectory

The Indian Media and Entertainment (M&E) sector, a cornerstone of the Orange Economy, was valued at ₹2.5 trillion in 2024 and is projected to grow to ₹3.067 trillion by 2027¹⁷. This growth is outpacing traditional sectors, with digital media revenue expected to cross ₹1.1 trillion by 2027¹⁷.

The sector already supports over 10 million livelihoods directly and indirectly¹⁷. The "multiplier effect" of the Orange Economy is particularly evident in the "Concert Economy" and live entertainment, which fuel demand for hospitality, local transport, and security, thereby revitalising urban and rural services¹⁹.

Technology and the Creative Renaissance

The integration of Artificial Intelligence (AI) into the creative economy is a strategic driver for the Viksit Bharat vision¹⁷. Unlike Western models that often view AI as a tool for cost-cutting, India's approach is "preservationist and inclusive"¹⁷. AI tools like "Kalaasetu" are being used for the preservation of cultural heritage, while the establishment of the Indian Institute of Creative Technologies (IICT) ensures a pipeline of high-end AI-native creative talent¹⁷. Furthermore, initiatives like the World Audio Visual and Entertainment Summit (WAVES) use technology to export Indian cultural narratives globally, enhancing the nation's soft power¹⁷.

Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS): Holistic Development and Education

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 formally recognises the Indian Knowledge System (IKS) as an integral component of modern education²². IKS encompasses diverse fields such as philosophy, medicine, mathematics, and environmental studies, offering a holistic approach that harmonises the physical, mental, and spiritual dimensions of life²².

Transforming Pedagogy and Student Well-being

By embedding IKS into mainstream curricula, the NEP 2020 aims to bridge the gap between India's rich intellectual heritage and the needs of a 21st-century knowledge economy²⁴. This involves reviving traditional pedagogical methods such as experiential learning, storytelling, and community engagement²². The integration of disciplines like Ayurveda and Yoga is expected to enhance mental health and emotional intelligence among students, addressing the limitations of purely rote-based learning models²².

Ethical Leadership Rooted in Dharma

A significant aspect of IKS is its contribution to leadership paradigms. The vision of Viksit Bharat 2047 calls for a leadership culture that is ethically grounded and people-centric²⁶. Inspired by the Bhagavad Gita, the "Dharma-centric leadership model" emphasizes *nishkama karma* (selfless action) and *samatva* (equanimity)²⁶. By institutionalising these values in governance and corporate leadership, India can cultivate a future-ready culture that prioritises intergenerational welfare and institutional accountability²⁶.

Digital Integration: Overcoming Linguistic Barriers with Bhashini

For cultural integration to be truly effective in a nation of 1.4 billion people, it must address the linguistic divide²⁸. The 'Bhashini' initiative, part of the Digital India program, uses AI and Natural Language Processing (NLP) to provide multilingual access to digital content and services in 22 official languages³⁰.

Empowering the Rural and Non-Literate Population

Bhashini's "Voice-First" multilingual solution is a game-changer for digital inclusion²⁸. By allowing citizens to interact with technology in their mother tongue, it enables non-English speakers to participate in the digital economy and access essential e-governance services²⁸. For example, the MahaVISTAAR-AI app provides real-time agricultural advisory services to farmers in their native languages, directly impacting the *Annadata* pillar of the 2047 vision³².

By addressing linguistic diversity, Bhashini fosters a "digitally unified nation" where technology bridges the divide rather than widening it²⁸. This is essential for achieving universal access to healthcare and education, as it ensures that crucial information reaches every citizen, regardless of their native tongue or literacy level³⁰.

Cultural Mapping: Revitalising the Rural Economy

The National Mission on Cultural Mapping (NMCM) aims to preserve and promote India's rich heritage by documenting the cultural assets of its 6.5 lakh villages³⁴. The 'Mera Gaon Meri Dharohar' (MGMD) portal, launched under this mission, serves as a digital repository of India's "rich cultural tapestry"³⁴.

Strengthening Identity and Livelihoods

Cultural mapping identifies local art forms, oral traditions, and traditional knowledge, providing a platform for rural artists to gain recognition and access government welfare schemes³⁵. By creating a national database of cultural assets, the mission aims to strengthen local cultural identity and foster "heritage-based livelihoods"¹². This approach is central to the "Vocal for Local" and "Atmanirbhar Bharat" missions, as it revitalises rural economies through sustainable tourism and local entrepreneurship³⁵.

As India embarks on its journey toward net-zero emissions by 2070, the integration of Traditional Ecological Knowledge (TEK) is essential for climate resilience³⁷. India's ancient texts and indigenous practices offer time-tested solutions for resource management and environmental conservation³⁸.

Water Security and Sustainable Architecture

Traditional water harvesting methods, such as *Johads* in Rajasthan and *Kuhls* in Himachal Pradesh, provide sustainable alternatives to energy-intensive modern infrastructure³⁷. Research indicates that investing in water security can generate significant economic returns, and traditional practices are a cost-effective way to achieve this⁴⁰.

Similarly, Indian vernacular architecture, guided by principles found in the *Shilpasashtra*, emphasizes climate responsiveness and thermal comfort using local materials³⁸. These designs are not mere aesthetic choices but deliberate strategies for energy efficiency³⁸.

The 3.5 crore-strong Indian diaspora acts as a vital pillar of India's soft power²¹. As cultural ambassadors, members of the diaspora promote Indian traditions and values globally, fostering people-to-people connections that go beyond formal diplomacy⁴¹. They also contribute significantly to the national economy through remittances and investments in Indian startups, fostering innovation and growth⁴².

Cultural Diplomacy and Leadership

India's "spiritual diplomacy" and historical foundations—rooted in peace and universalism—resonate globally²¹. Initiatives like the International Yoga Day and the promotion of the Buddhist Circuit position India as a global leader in wellness and cultural dialogue²¹. By sharing its heritage through innovative digital platforms and youth exchange programs, India builds global goodwill and strengthens its image as a responsible and culturally rich global power²¹.
